It is no wonder Morocco has been feted by artists and writers for decades and continues to enchant all who visit.





















Come eye-to-eye with an elephant in Amboseli; or marvel at Lake Nakuru, flecked with thousands of flamingos.







In these sun-soaked lands, ancient tribes, such as the Maasai, Kikuyu, and Samburu, retain their traditional customs, living in relative harmony with the natural world.

Beyond the world-famous safari parks lies a trove of coastal treasures.

You can snorkel and dive fishrich coral reefs, relax on pearly beaches, experience the melting pot of cultures and cuisines in Mombasa and Malindi, and explore tropical islands steeped in Swahili history.

Topographically, Kenya is stunning. Surrounded by calderas and mountain ranges, the Great Rift Valley divides the country.

To the east of this sweeping valley, you can climb the snow-cloaked equatorial peaks of Mount Kenya and fish for trout in crystal-clear streams.

Hell's Gate National Park harbours obsidian caves and hisses with natural geysers and hot springs.

As the oldest European settlement in Africa, Cape Town has a rich and, at times, turbulent past.

At Robben Island, history buffs can see where Nelson Mandela was incarcerated for 18 years. In the hinterland, elegant Stellenbosch is a Nirvana for foodies.

Along the rugged coast, scenic drives slice into mountains that plunge to the sea, penguins waddle on pristine beaches, and Cape Point is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site with one of the richest floral kingdoms in the world.

This city of high-rises and shopping malls has transformed itself from a desert outpost to a destination du-jour, where tourists flock for sales bargains, sunshine, and family fun.

Dubai is famous for sightseeing attractions such as the Burj Khalifa (the world's tallest building) and shopping malls that come complete with mammoth aquariums and indoor ski slopes.

Singapore's first UNESCO World Heritage Site – the Singapore Botanic Gardens – and walk through the National Orchid Garden which boasts a sprawling display of 60,000 orchid plants.

Besides the samba, this cosmopolitan city is known for its Carnival, the bossa nova, and Copacabana Beach.



Its most famous landmark may be the Christ the Redeemer statue that sits atop Corcovado Mountain.

The easily recognized emblem of Rio de Janeiro, the rounded rock peak of Sugar Loaf juts out of a tree-covered promontory, rising 394 meters above the beaches and city.

Its summit is one of the first places tourists go, for views of Rio and the harbour, and for the thrill of riding suspended in a cable car between Sugar Loaf and the Morro da Urca, a lower peak from which a second cableway connects to the city.





















t is little wonder London is one of the world's top tourist destinations, attracting upward of 15 million visitors each year.

Britain's capital city is a vibrant arts and entertainment center (its theaters are always busy), and 50 years after the Beatles, the country's music scene still rocks.

London also offers one of the planet's greatest concentrations of cultural attractions.

Many picturesque bridges link the city's 90 islands, eight of them old wooden bascule bridges, including the MagereBrug(Mager Bridge), one of the city's most frequently photographed.

Here, the preferred method of transportation is a bicycle. Rent a pair and head out to explore the Golden Age that inspired the design of the city.

From Anne Frank's house to the Van GoghMuseumand the many bridges, you would not have any trouble filling each day with adventure.
